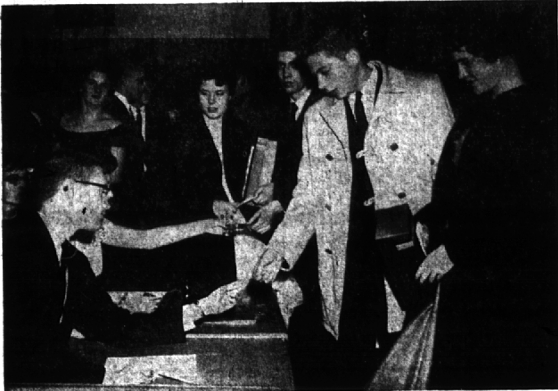


# Students Welcome 1959 With 'Auld' Friends and New



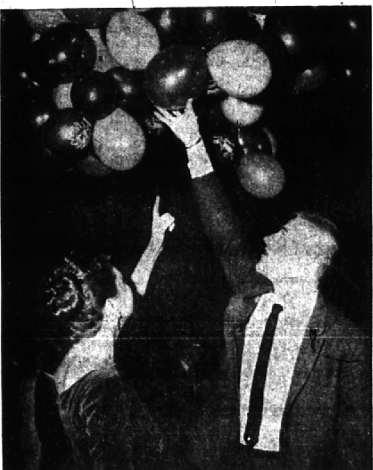

### REGISTRATION NOTICE

FOR THE GENERAL PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 1959

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, County of Oakland, State of Michigan: NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in conformity with the Michigan Election Law, the final date for registration in order to vote in the General Primary Election is Monday, January 19, 1959, at 8:00 p.m.

TO VOTE AT THIS ELECTION, all persons must be registered.

Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the City of Birmingham thirty days prior to February 16, 1959, are eligible to register.

TO REGISTER: Call in person at the office of the City Clerk in the Municipal Building on or before 8:00 P.M. Monday, January 19, 1959.

TO TRANSFER a registration from one address to another WITHIN THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, send a signed request to the office of the City Clerk stating present address, former address, and date of moving to present address. Such transfer may be made any time up to and including Monday, January 19, 1959, at 8:00 P.M.

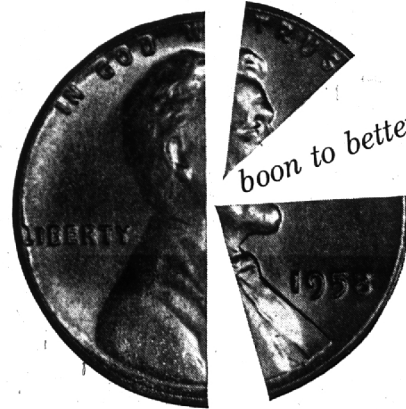
HOURS OF REGISTRATION NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in addition to regular office hours, Monday through Friday of each week, 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., the office of the City Clerk will be open for the purpose of receiving registrations during the following hours:

Saturday, January 17, 1959 — 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.  
Monday, January 19, 1959 — 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

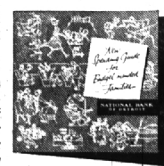
