Commissioner William Burgum had asked the city to check advisability of the new signs. Recently Raynale traffic has been required to halt at Chesterfield.

Motorists Do 'Bang-up' Job Here in June

Fin and fender-denters were at near-peak in Birmingham during the month of June.

They racked up \$15,334 in automobile damages—double May's total—and injured 19 persons, as compared to six in May.

THE BAD record is even worse, Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley said, when one considers the near-perfect driving conditions registered in June.

The police department has investigated 362 of the accidents reported during the first half of 1959, he said. Investigators found that 280 (almost 80 per cent) were caused by three violations.

Failure to yield right of way caused 142 accidents; following too closely added 91 more, and improper passing swelled the total by another 47.

OFFICERS, Moxley warned, will watch closely for:

- 1) Drivers pulling into oncoming traffic after stopping at a stop sign.
- 2) Drivers failing to yield the right of way to vehicles already in open intersections.
- 3) Drivers pulling into moving traffic when they leave their parking space at the curb.
- 4) Drivers failing to yield right of way to traffic on the street, when pulling from an alley or driveway.
- 5) Drivers failing to yield right of way to traffic when making a left turn.

Commission Meets On DPW Buildings

Troy city commissioners will meet with an architect next week to discuss the possible construction of a new DPW building on the Rochester road site.

The commissioners discussed the means of financing the new garage Monday.

Troy residents defeated a \$125,000 bond issue for the DPW buildings at the April 6 election, but city officials have been under fire because the DPW uses a quonset for storage at Crooks and 11 Mile roads.

Commissioners have already discussed during the \$48,000-1950-60 contingency fund into a DPW building program.

Yamasaki Eyes Commission Post

Noted architect Minoru Yamasaki is considering a position on the Troy city commission, according to Mayor Robert Fisher.

If he accepts, Yamasaki would fill the post left by Morris A. Wattles who resigned July 1.

YAMASAKI has not yet committed himself and he might not be able to attend all the meetings. A commissioner must attend at least eight of the 12 meetings or he is automatically dismissed.

The Seattle-born architect may miss some business if he accepts the seat. City Attorney Stanley Burke said that a charter revision would prevent Yamasaki from accepting city building and architectural contracts.

Builder Gets Another Chance

Building company owner O. J. Roll was granted another chance to request rezoning of his proposed subdivision in north Troy by the city commission Monday night.

Roll requested a rezoning of lots in the area bounded by E. Long Lake, Adams, Beach and Wattles roads. Current restrictions hold the lots at 30,000 square feet and 18,000 square-foot lots.

The proposed subdivision is surrounded by the 30,000 square-foot lots and Meadowlane subdivision president E. A. Wagner, 4660 Adams, told the commissioners that "We want equal treatment or we'll take it to court."

Two Youngsters Suffer Injuries

Two Troy youths were severely injured in traffic accidents over the week end.

Taken to Beaumont hospital were Glen Campbell, 15, and Mrs. S. Campbell, 2315 Orpington, and Michael C. Szepal, 5, 2588 E. Maple.

CAMPBELL suffered a broken right leg when his bicycle collided with a car driven by James M. Berzley, 23, of 418 W. Woodruff, Hazel Park, at John K near Lincoln on Saturday.

The Szepal youth was struck by a car driven by Mrs. Erik A. Schevo, 37, of Centerline, at Maple and Minnesota, on Saturday. He sustained a fractured skull. She told police the youth ran in front of the car.

A Question Of Views in July Show

A July exhibition—"Sculpture Seen Anew: the Bronze Age to Brancusi"—is being staged at the C. Z. a Brook galleries, announced Wallace Mitchell, head of the galleries.

It is a circulating show of photographs of sculpture, snapped by Clarence J. Laughlin.

THE SHOW includes outstanding examples of each great sculptural period, as exemplified in American collections, including 20 museum masterpieces.

The show also attempts to outline and point up the various methods by which the camera can interpret sculpture, and indicates the possibility that the camera can convey an experience of the work of sculpture which could not be achieved by direct observation.

There are approximately 400 prints in the show, mounted on 105 large panels, including two to five images of each sculpture.

ALSO ON view at the Cranbrook Galleries is the 1959 Annual Exhibition of Student work, and a third exhibition of children's work from the Young Peoples Art center sponsored jointly by the Junior League of Birmingham and Cranbrook Academy of Art galleries.

The Galleries are open to the public daily except Mondays and major holidays from 2 to 5 p.m.
