Central Methodist church was the scene for the wedding Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock of Beverly S. Selters and George A. Atkinson.

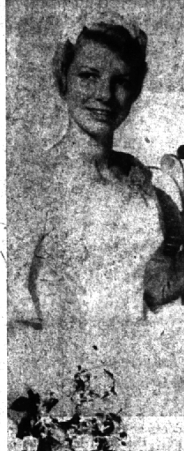
