

Bham's Baseball Programs Praised



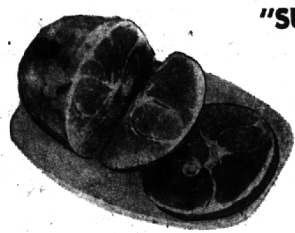
