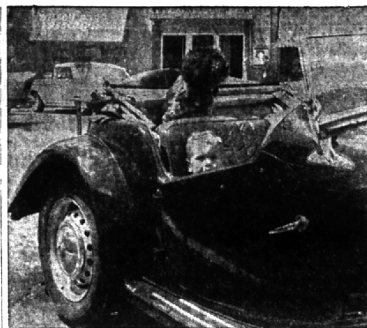


Royal Oak to Buy New Library Site
