3-Way Meeting Held to Discuss Road Widening

LATHRUP—City Administrator Gerald Stone told council members Monday evening that he had attended a meeting with Paul Van Rookel of the county road commission and Robert McNutt, Southfield city manager, on the widening of Southfield road.

Stone explained that the group had studied three different propositions. At a cost of \$59,000 Southfield road could be widened to 48 feet to 12 Mile road.

Five lanes costing \$628,000 would be ideal, but with Lathrup financing half the cost is not taken. Further study will be made on the problem by united city officials.

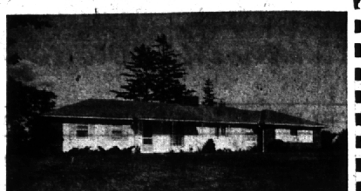

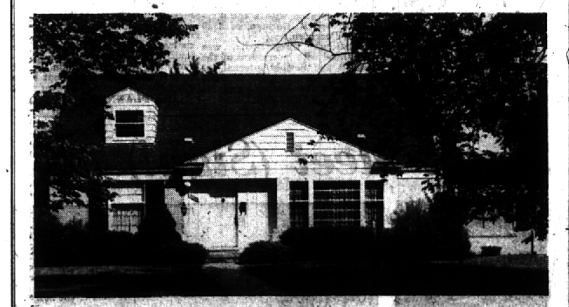
