**That Pool You Built— It's Fun Only If You Plan**

LANSING—Backyard swimming pools can become sources of illness and injury if not built and operated properly, the Michigan Department of health said recently.

Before entering into a purchasing agreement, prospective buyers should have plans for their pool checked by a local government and health officials, the department urged. Checking in advance will insure that the pool conforms with local ordinances and won't endanger health.

**THE FOLLOWING** pointers on construction and operation of private pools are recommended by the state health department:

- 1) At the start of each swimming season, drain all water and scrub down the pool sides and bottom are watertight so pool water won't leak out and ground water seep in.
- 2) **FILL THE** pool with water that is safe to drink. Don't use raw lake or stream water.
- 3) Equip the pool with an adequate pump and filter. Use continuously.
- 4) Add chlorine to the water with a mechanical feed pump. A pump is more effective than adding the chemical by hand. The chlorine content should be kept at five tenths of a part of chlorine to every million parts of water. Kits for testing chlorine content can be purchased from pool supply houses.
- 5) **POOL WATER** should be kept slightly alkaline to avoid eye irritations. Water can be made alkaline by adding lime or soda ash just before the water goes through the filter.
- 6) Electrical wires shouldn't run above or near the pool.
- 7) **JUST BEFORE** going into the pool, all persons should spray their feet to remove grass and dirt. Chemical foot baths aren't recommended.
- 8) All persons should shower or bathe before entering the pool.
- 9) **PERSONS WITH** colds, sore throats, skin sores and other signs of possible illness shouldn't use the pool.
- 10) A fence should be placed around the pool or property to prevent youngsters, adults and stray animals from falling into the pool accidentally.
- 11) **AN ADULT** swimmer should be present when children use the pool.

**'Unfair' Obligation Would be Assumed By City of B'ham**

If there's no law against it, Birmingham will pick up the tabs ranging from 15 cents to one dollar which 2,000 property owners have been paying on a 1926 Royal Oak drain assessment.

Commissioners agreed to this for the remaining seven years if City Attorney Dean Beier finds no statute forbidding it. The total amount would be \$1,300. Many property owners, said City Finance Director James H. Purkiss, are not required to pay it because they bought lots which went through the state scavenger sales. This cancelled their obligations.

Purkiss said it was "inconsistent" that other property owners should be required to continue paying their Royal Oak drain assessments.

14) Living boards aren't recommended for small pools because of dangers to divers and swimmers.  
15) Sloping sides, sharp dropoffs and slippery walkways at poolside are dangerous design features that should be avoided.
