Nickel Family Honored For Shady Garden Plot

The C. E. Nickels at 928 Westchesterway are known as outstanding gardeners in this area for their planning and planting of a shady garden plot which they have developed themselves. They are included on the list of outstanding plantmen in this area by the Michigan Horticultural society.

There are only a few spots where the sun may shine through around five hours a day. In these areas they have their climbing roses and clematis vines, especially the Henry variety which has the chalk white flowers.

"A shady garden is easy to maintain when the plant pattern is once established. The construction of structures such as a terrace, ornamental fencing, bird feeders, etc. are important when you can't hold the eye with gay flowers such as you see around the flowering season in the sunny garden," remarked Mrs. Nickel.

A lot of people take their plants outdoors for the summer. That is good practice but your large leaf philodendrons will be in plenty of trouble if they are placed outdoors, due to the light factor.

THE TERRACE is approximately 12 feet by 30 feet and has ivy planted around the edge of this elevated detail which has an entrance from the family room. There is a peninsula extending from the terrace which has primroses to welcome the spring season. The remainder of the season the leaves of the primroses provide texture interest.

This garden because of the shade does not have crabgrass. Virginia bluebells are seen in great numbers in the early spring. Forget-me-nots, funkia, clematis (paniculate Mrs. Burlingame will take half shade) and variegated leaf plants provide around the calendar interest.

The Nickels planted their tulips 18 inches deep and for the last six years have enjoyed peak performance without taking up the bulbs. The mother tulips are favorites and they have flowers shaped like a lily of the valley.

The Nickels always like to share their garden with other garden lovers. So here is a chance for you to enjoy another local garden.

DURING THE Garden Tour the Earl Triplets opened their garden at 480 N. Williamsbury. There I saw a few details which will interest the readers.

The area next to the driveway at the rear of the property contained the perennial bed of choice plants. It was wide and next to the driveway there was a border of myrtle. How clever, the margin up to the first plant would look neat and maintenance would be cut down as myrtle as their border interest.
