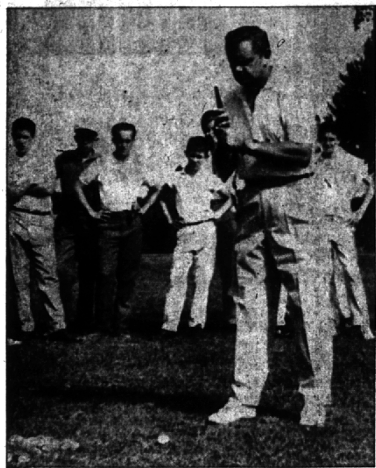

Community Tennis Entry Form

The Birmingham Community tennis tournament, co-sponsored by the Birmingham Eccentric and the Birmingham city recreation department, will be held July 28-Aug. 7, at Eton park.

The tournament is for players in the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills school districts and Lathrup. It will be played in five divisions. Junior boys and girls single divisions are for youngsters 8-12 while boys and girls divisions will be held for players 13-17. Mens and womens divisions are for persons 18 years and over and all ages must be as of Jan. 1, 1959.

This form should be filled out and mailed to Community Tennis, Sports Department, The Birmingham Eccentric. Entries will be in the hands of tournament officials by noon, July 21.

Players can compete in both singles and doubles. Players from this area may play on a doubles team with a person not from the area.
