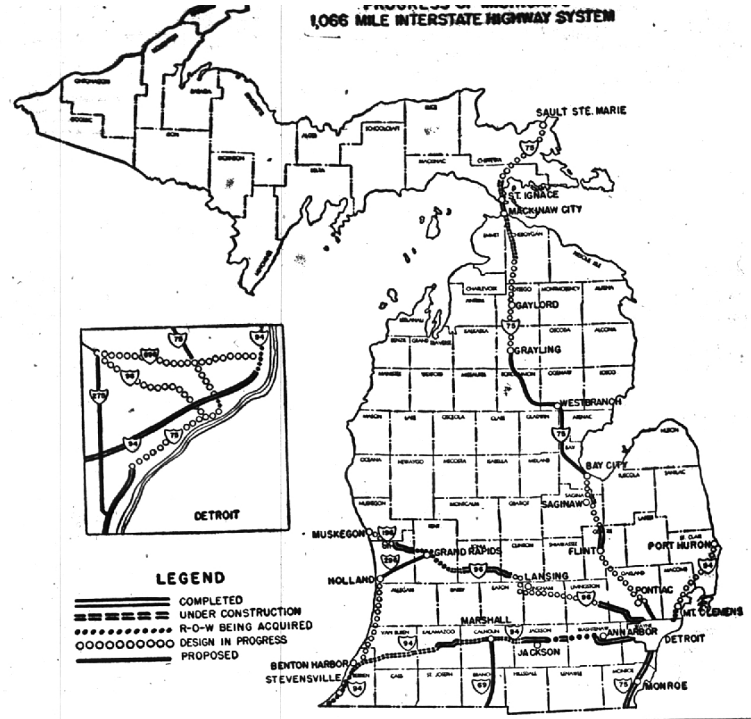


# 'And They're Off'—with 858 Miles to Go

Michigan's 1,066-mile National Interstate Highway System is moving into high gear under Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie's present \$1 1/4 billion five-year (1957-1962) construction program. This program calls for 580 miles of new Interstate Highway routes—more than half of the state's ultimate 1,066 miles. Already 208 miles of

Interstate routes are open in Michigan and another 108 are under construction. Major highway news will be made this year when the approximately 220-mile long Interstate route 94—from Detroit to the Indiana border south of Stevensville—is expected to be entirely under contract.

The board of education, in a buying mood this week, approved bids on furniture for the Groves high school, fencing, asphalt paving and a new car.

The \$6,775.80 bid of the Brunswick company for business education furniture and the \$9,815.40 bid of the same firm for cafeteria tables and chairs in the Groves high school were approved.

Asphalt refinishing at Seaholm, Barnum and Pembroke schools will cost \$5,028. Bid was made by the Lint Asphalt paving company, 5720 Middlebelt.

The board approved purchase of a driver training car from North Chevrolet, Birmingham for \$1,770. It is a four-door sedan six-cylinder.

THE BOARD approved the bid of the SS Pirie company for conversion of Adams school to gas heat. The bill: \$15,918.

The board re-approved student accident insurance—but at a slightly increased rate.

The insurance, which covers students while attending all school functions as well as enroute to and from school, will cost the student two dollars next year. Last year's rate was \$1.50.

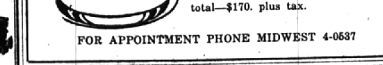
