### Touch of Romance Colors Start of Tribute Fund UF

The romance of an unmarked package from Coris Madern, California, a valuable lady's diamond ring and the helping of a needy person somewhere in the Pontiac area mark the beginning of the Tribute Fund of the Pontiac Area United Fund.

Several weeks ago, Norman Patton of 3401 Devonbrook drive, Bloomfield Hills, owner of Connolly's Jewelers, received an unmarked package containing a valuable ring. An anonymous handwritten note asked that the dollar value of the ring be given to charity.

THE DONOR of the ring may be doubly happy today. The sale of the ring for \$125 marked a major contribution to the newly established Tribute Fund of the Pontiac Area United Fund.

The Tribute fund is devoted to aiding individuals and families throughout the Pontiac area whose personal tragedies have come to the attention of local social service agencies.

Dollars are donated to the Fund through special requests by local Pontiac residents. Many contributions have been made during instances of bereavement. The Tribute Fund sends an engraved card to the bereaved family stating the donor's name and that a contribution has been made.

### Contractor's Appeal Delays Courthouse

...so it may be the first of the four before county supervisors get their new courthouse and office building.

The supervisors waived the low bid for construction of the buildings and as a result ended up in court. The county awarded the \$2-million general to J. A. Fredman, Pontiac, after waiting the low bid of A. Z. Shmina and Sons, Dearborn contractors.

Dennis Boyle, attorney for Shmina, said he will file an appeal with the state supreme court. The Oakland county circuit court upheld the county's bid awarding action.

THIS IS the second delay in the path of the county buildings. Another case began by a downtown Pontiac group who sued over the method of financing, took two years. The decision was handed down in February.

THE EARLIEST possible date on the second case will probably be in October of this year, totaling almost a three-year wait.

County Attorney Norman E. Barnard said last week that they would try for an early hearing but doubted that anything else could be done.

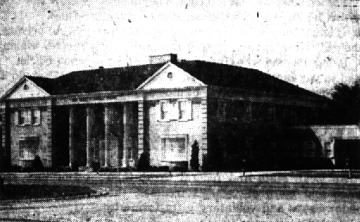
