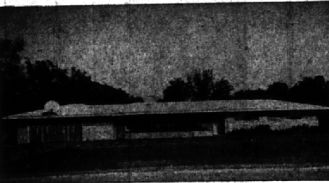

MacMahon also presented blueprints for the proposed addition to Hickory Grove school. Aug. 18 was set as the date for opening bids on construction of the three classroom addition.

A landscaping contract was awarded Woody Acres nursery on a bid of \$4912. Work will include improvement of baseball and track field at the junior high school as well as landscaping the school addition, which is presently under construction.

Minor repairs at Vaughan school were also approved by the board. In addition the board set tuition rate for special students. For elementary students it will be \$227 a day with transportation furnished. For secondary students the cost will be \$238 a day with the use of the school bus system included. Only special students accepted are children whose families are planning a move into the school district within the school year.

The library circulation is now 11,594, as compared to a total of 4,718 four years ago.

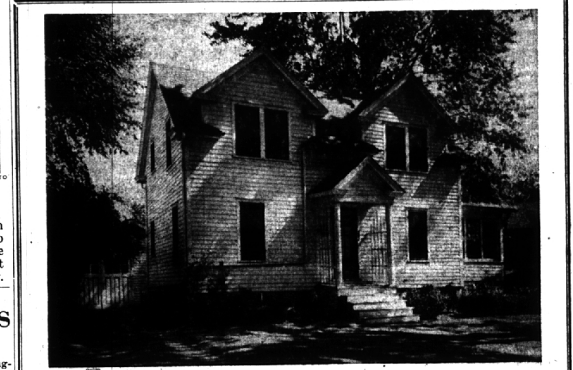

"They certainly did," Bradley observed.

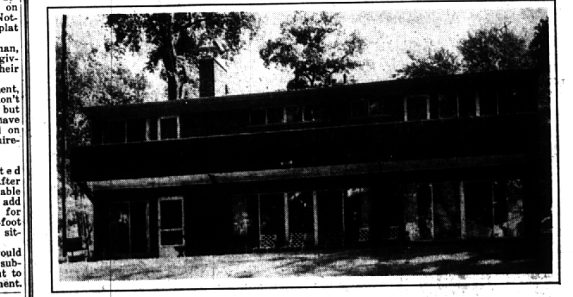
