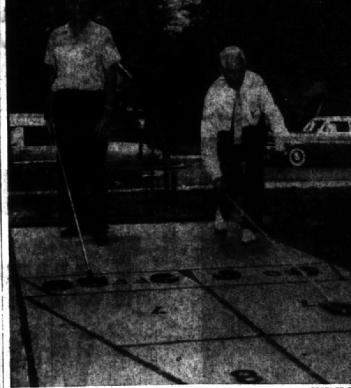

Vets Planning on GI Bill Advised to Apply Early

"Apply now. Don't get caught in the rush." This advice was offered today by Lloyd H. Jameson, manager of the Veterans Administration's regional office in Detroit.

- 1) Since the law allows a veteran to change his GI course only once, he should give plenty of thought, in advance, to his goal and to the training program leading to his goal.
- 2) IF HE IS undecided about what to train for, he may ask for VA vocational counseling.
- 3) HE SHOULD be sure that his course has been approved by the state in which the school is located. VA regional offices—and not VA headquarters in Washington, D. C.—can furnish information about approved courses.
- 4) If he is completely filled out to his school before he even gets to the school with his GI check list.
- 5) THE GI TRAINING application should be filled out and signed. The veteran should send it, along with a photostat or certified copy of his separation certificate, to the VA Regional Office serving his area.
- 6) The application should get to VA as soon as possible. This will enable VA to smooth out any snags before school begins.
- 7) A veteran with dependents should have the necessary proof of dependency ready when VA asks for it. For a wife, this would be a photostat of the marriage certificate and a photostat of the birth certificate.
- 8) A VETERAN should take a long enough month of his own to tide him over the first two months of training. It takes about that long, ordinarily for his first monthly GI check to reach him.
- 9) If a veteran's payments can be made only after each month of training is completed, and not before, he should get a certification to get checks in the mail.
