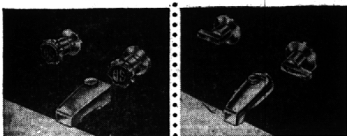

Baptists Undecided About Architecture of New Church

The design for a modern chapel which received nationwide publicity for the Begrow and Brown architects may not be the type of church the Westwood Baptist congregation, Beverly Hills, will build.

Lawrence E. Flora, head of the board of trustees, said the cost of building the modern church designed by Brown and Begrow was not as low as preliminary estimates.

He said the type of architecture was originally picked because it is considered one of the most inexpensive types of building.

CHURCH OFFICIALS are investigating the costs of other types of architecture before deciding definitely about the Begrow and Brown design.

Rev. David E. Gillespie, whose resignation is effective Sept. 15 said that in the rapidly expanding area around Beverly Hills a church is badly needed.

THE DESIGN proposed by the architects has a hexagon shaped floor with the pews gathered close to the pulpit. The walls are glass with deep colors behind the pulpit fading into almost transparent glass at the rear.

Most prominent part of the building is the roof which is composed of three white hyperbolic parabolas in a design resembling a bent potato chip.

The chapel which was planned to be the first of three buildings would be built in front of the farm house which would be restored for the Sunday school.

Rev. Holme Plans Annual Sermon At Area Church

The Rev. Dr. Benjamin F. Holme will make his annual summer appearance in the pulpit of the Franklin Community church at 10 a.m. Sunday.

He first preached at the church five years ago and has been so enthusiastically received that the supply committee asks him to return every summer.

He has been preaching since 1921 and has served in parishes in Illinois and Michigan. For six years he was associate minister at Central Methodist church, Detroit, and for five years pastor of St. Paul's Methodist church in Monroe.

Dr. Holme served 13 years at Westlawn Methodist church in Detroit before taking over as superintendent of the Detroit district of the Methodist church.

At present he is the superintendent of the Methodist union of greater Detroit which is the agency serving city church work in this area.

The Rev. Mrs. Constance D. Pipok, assistant minister of the Franklin Community church will conduct the service.

Methodists Seek Church Nursery School Director

The First Methodist church is seeking a well-qualified director for a church nursery school which was approved by the official board July 14.

The nursery school was approved by the board on a recommendation made by the commission on education. Four-year-olds will attend on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and three-year-olds on Tuesday and Thursday.
