Under the company plan, 29 telephone exchanges that serve more than 100 Detroit area communities will be split into six area Yellow Page directories.

These area White Page directories will contain those same 29 exchanges.

THE INITIAL copies of the re-designed Yellow Pages will be issued in December. Each heading will have complete alphabetical lists of all establishments served by Birmingham, Mayfair, Southfield, Troy and Royal Oak exchanges.

The new White Pages will be distributed next spring.

They will have a single alphabetical list of all telephone users in the communities served by Birmingham, Mayfair, Southfield, Troy, Auburn Heights, Commerce, Drayton Plains, Pontiac, Rochester and Walled Lake.

Wider W. Maple To Get Special Police Attention

Where W. Maple meets Cranbrook road has become a two-signal intersection.

It's because Maple to the east has been widened to four lanes. State traffic code requires the extra signal, which met with Birmingham commission's approval Monday night.

City Commissioner William Burgum inquired about enforcement of the westbound Maple lane from Westchesterway to Cranbrook. He said he feels too little attention has been given that stretch.

"With the widening, and when the Chesterfield light changes to green, it could well become a drag strip unless it is watched," the commissioner observed.

POLICE CHIEF Ralph W. Moxley said his department and Bloomfield township work closely together on this municipality boundary.

"When we see a flagrant violation on Bloomfield's side, we call their officers and swear out a complaint. A ticket can be issued," Moxley explained. "They also do it on our (south) side of Maple."

Bloomfield Township Police Chief Norman Dehnke told The Birmingham Eccentric he also would ask his men to pay special attention to this area.

\$1 Million Tax Lien Filed In Oakland

Federal authorities filed a tax lien of more than \$1 million in Oakland county recently against an Almont, Mich. couple.

The lien of \$1,065,103 was filed against Glenn M. Averill and his wife, Mary.

James Dean, deputy director of the Detroit office of International Revenue service, said it was filed in Oakland because it is believed the Averills have arrears here.

The sum represents taxes and penalties on unreported income from 1956 through 1956.

An FPC order will permit Panhandle Eastern Pipe Line company to begin the program at midnight Aug. 16.


The Consumers Power said last week that 50,000 gas space heating customers will be added as a result of the okay. Applicants will be notified by mail as soon as the order becomes effective.
