Des Moines: 'Mayday' to Oakland Co.

An urgent appeal for 10 nurses for polio duty at the Memorial hospital in Des Moines, Ia., was made today by Mrs. Mildred E. Bennett, executive director, Oakland County chapter, American Red Cross, following a message from Miss Kathryn Fitzpatrick, Red Cross Midwestern area Nursing director, St. Louis, Mo. "The Methodist hospital in Des Moines is now handling about 60 polio cases and Iowa Health department officials say the peak will not be reached for at least two weeks. Most of the cases are children," Miss Fitzpatrick said.

additional nurses undoubtedly will be needed in the next few weeks," Miss Fitzpatrick added. "It is not our intention to drain vitally needed nurses from our own community," Mrs. Bennett said. "However, there are many registered nurses not active in the profession and perhaps some can arrange their personal affairs to serve in this period when death and serious crippling may be prevented." Miss Fitzpatrick reported that the appeal for Red Cross to recruit nurses was made by the Methodist hospital in Des Moines and the National Foundation. The Foundation will pay the cost of transportation to Des Moines and will provide maintenance in addition to salary while the nurse is serving in polio work. All nurses available for polio duty have been requested to contact the Oakland county chapter, American Red Cross, 116 Franklin boulevard, Fontana.

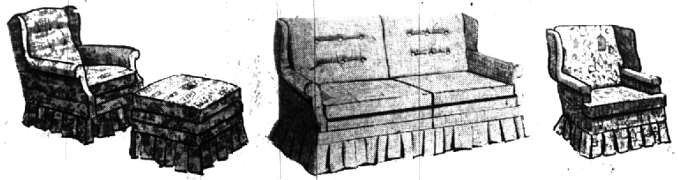

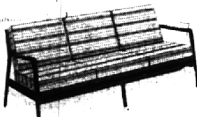
