Visiting Nurses Aided 175 Here in Past Year

The United Community Services reported last week that the Visiting Nurse association, a Torch Drive agency, provided nursing services to 175 residents of Birmingham, seven in Bloomfield Hills, and 57 in Bloomfield township last year.

The association is made up of 162 persons who devote their time and efforts to providing professional services to persons bedridden through accident, childbirth, illness or old age. Last year, they made a total of 116,855 visits to 15,686 patients, which included 3,364 newborn babies.

THESE SERVICES are extended to residents of South Macomb county, all of Wayne County, South

work consultant, 29 home aides and one part-time physician.

Their services are spread over more than 50 towns and cities with a total population of well over three million. In each community, they work in close cooperation with the medical profession, local health departments, community agencies, and educational institutions.

ANY PATIENT in need of the services offered by the Visiting Nurses is eligible if under medical direction and living within the area served. Most cases are referred to the association by friends, family physicians, social or governmental agencies.

Almost half of the patients covered by the latest VNA report were new mothers, babies and health supervision cases who were served primarily for the purpose of preventing disease and promoting health. The other half were sick persons who received almost 80 per cent of the visits. Most of the sick patients had long term illnesses.

Services of the Visiting Nurse association are available to all who need them, regardless of ability to pay. The full fee is \$5 for a professional visit. The amount charged however, is regulated to the patient's ability to pay. Last year, for instance, patients paid directly
