"Grown-up" girls bring in dolls for new wigs and hair sets before putting them away in chests for their children.

One of Mrs. Parish's most unusual services is the handwoven human hair wigs she weaves in the backshop. A swath of hair brought in by a mother or daughter is woven into a new wig for a favorite doll.

ALTHOUGH THERE seems to be more character dolls and dressup dolls Mrs. Parish denied the rumor that baby dolls were being popularly.

"Children still love their baby dolls," she said, "Another doll that seems to live forever is the Raggedy Ann and Raggedy Andy cloth dolls.

The type of doll that is becoming more and more missed by the old buying public is the old cloth bodied baby doll that said "Mama."

"We have dolls that cry and dolls with music boxes, but they don't even make the "Mama" dolls anymore," Mrs. Parish said.

LIFE WITH DOLLS of necessity involves their mothers, the little children. Mrs. Parish told of little girls who can't bear to trade their old worn out dolls for brand new ones so they come to Mrs. Parish.

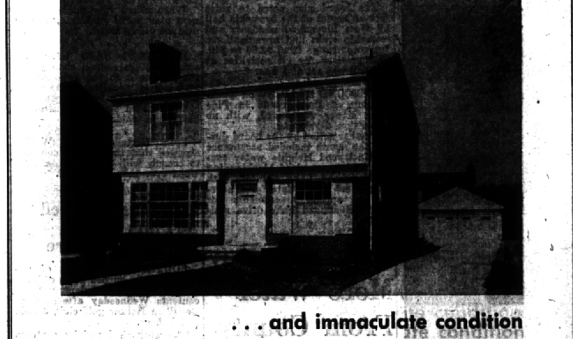

Southfield News Briefs

Southfield Finishes Fiscal Year with \$75,578 Surplus

SOUTHFIELD—The city of Southfield ended the fiscal year with a \$75,578 surplus, about \$10,000 more than was expected.

Most of the money will go toward the first payment on the 166-acre civic center site on Evergreen between 10 and 11 Mile roads.

The yearly audit showed a \$81,200 surplus in the road account. Restricted by law to road use it may be used to help pay for widening of Southfield road.

City Administrator Robert J. McNutt said the surplus was created by a collection of more taxes than anticipated, slightly under spending of budgeted amounts, about \$9,800 from the township settlement and \$4,000 for the sale of two old garbage trucks.

Council Votes to Stop Greenfield-11 Mile Traffic Light Beaters

SOUTHFIELD—City council members have decided to prohibit right turns on Fairchild from 11 Mile and left turns onto Meadowdown from Greenfield to eliminate traffic cutting through residential Meadow Downs subdivision to miss the 11 Mile-Greenfield light.

City Administrator Robert J. McNutt said an excessive number of cars were using the two residential streets to bypass the intersection.

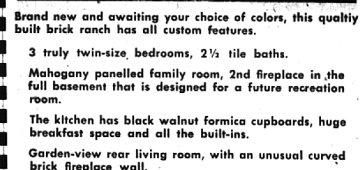
