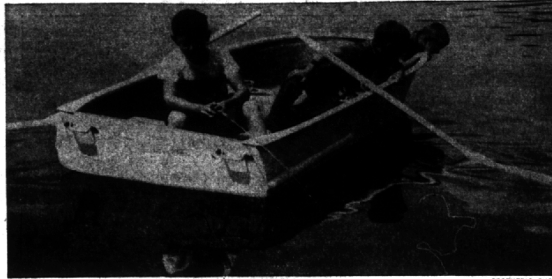
Cindy Clemens, teenage daughter of the Harvey Clemens, has been entertaining a former school friend, Bonnie Crampton of Bay City, this past week.

The Charing Cross Hamlet Home Owner association held their annual meeting and election of officers at the William McCaffrey home on Squirrel road recently.

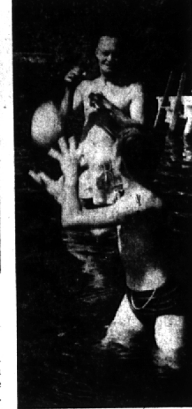

United Fund Drive Chairman Chosen

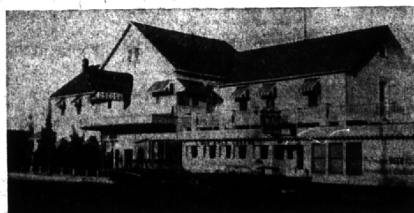
