May Change Some Deer Regulations

LANSING, July 30—Michigan's 1956 deer hunting regulations will be spotlighted when the Conservation Commission meets at the Higgins Lake training school August 5-7. As Conservation Department game officials outlined informally at the Commission's July meeting, the proposed changes would only affect special season regulations.

Camp deer regulations and regular buck and bow and arrow seasons are expected to remain the same as last year. Essentially, these changes would provide the following: 1) an increase in upper peninsula areas open to "any deer" shooting; 2) open to "any deer" shooting of deer in average kill quotas of deer per square mile in the northern lower peninsula together with a 10 percent increase in special hunting areas; and 3) a larger special season area in Allegan county.
