## Music Flowing Yet in Series At Cranbrook

The Detroit Symphony Woodwind ensemble with Karl Haas, pianist will be featured in the third concert of the Cranbrook Gardens Summer Music Festival Sunday, July 12. The program will be presented in the Cranbrook House gardens at 4:30 p.m., and will include works by Haydn, Beethoven and Poulenc.

The Detroit Symphony Woodwind ensemble has had a distinguished career since its inception two years ago. In great demand in the Detroit area, it has been invited to play for two seasons at the Wooster, Mass., fall music festival.

THIS WILL be its first appearance at Cranbrook. Members of the ensemble include Irvin Gilman, flutist featured in the recent Greek Theater concert; Paul Schaller, clarinet; Ronald Odmar, oboe; Charles Sirard, bassoon; and William Sabatini, French horn. All are soloists with the Detroit symphony. Karl Haas, pianist is the newly appointed Director of Fine Arts for station WJR. He was born and educated in Germany. After coming to this country in 1936 he studied with Benderson Netzer and Arthur Schnabel. He is founder and president of the Chamber Music Society of Detroit.

The Cranbrook Summer Festival will continue with a concert July 28 featuring the talented young pianist Ruth Meckler with Paul Olefsky, cello; Gordon Staples, violin and Paul Schaller, clarinet.

THE FINAL concert, August 2, will feature Detroit's outstanding pianist and teacher Mischa Kottler with Paul Olefsky and Gordon Staples.

Tickets for all concerts are on sale at Grinnells and at the Cranbrook gardens gate on Lone Pine road, Bloomfield Hills at concert time.
