DOWN TO EARTH

Hyde Family Shares Garden at Pilgrimage

During the Garden Pilgrimages the Arthur Hydes, 342 Waddington, shared their garden with garden lovers from metropolitan Detroit. Hyde is a well known architect so his work was not only noticed by the design of their home structure but the gardens possess real character.

In the rear garden geometric lines form rooms and the division is generally made by the use of evergreens which assure continued interest into the winter as designs are formed by snow on the "dividers."

The property has an underground sprinkling system which assures watering care given in the easiest fashion. The driveway circles around to the rear and a 3-foot wall has been formed at the edge of the driveway in a straight line by making a dry wall of broken concrete. "It would have been higher only we ran out of broken concrete," confessed Mrs. Hyde as we were viewing the stunning wall which is now covered by ivy.

THE TERRACE is a raised plateau about 3-feet high with a turf surface. Boxwood is around the perimeter of the terrace and green umbrella finishes the effect with its table and chairs. There are two oblong patterns which invite a stroll out to the focal point which is a fountain. The oblong patterns have 8 inches

of boxwood with white verberna in the center with a massed grouping in each pattern of five small pink geraniums.

A design for their fountain executed by the Hydes is a 3-foot circle made by small tiles with the well-known figure of Mrs. Burlingame "The Boy With The Turtle."

Near the kitchen exit Mrs. Hyde has been very successful growing Christmas Roses. It is a sheltered position facing north. They have a ten-foot copper bench which was given to Mrs. Hyde "upon request."

A copper bench is the finest tree a person can plant for a specimen. Be sure and plan on it being at least 60 feet high with a 30 foot diameter. Check for low overhead wires.

HYDE WAS VERY proud of his compost pile. It is 5-foot square made by using one-half rounds of cedar posts and building up to 5 1/2 feet. The trash of plant material is put in at the top and a moveable exit is located at the bottom for removing the dark, rich, "wormy" soil.

Now is the time to begin your panny plants for next year. Fill pots with vermiculite and soak them in a pan of water until the vermiculite is saturated. Sprinkle the seed on top, pat down and cover with a refrigerator bag so they need not be watered until the seedlings begin to poke through when the bag is removed.

This is the last call for pruning evergreen denser. Do not shear pines, spruce or firs. Keep evergreens looking young and not gnarled with coarse branches.

B'ham HS Student Shines at MSU Science Institute

EAST LANSING — Denis Alix, 5546 W. Maple, Birmingham, is among 100 carefully selected high school students attending a comprehensive six-week honors science institute at Michigan State university.

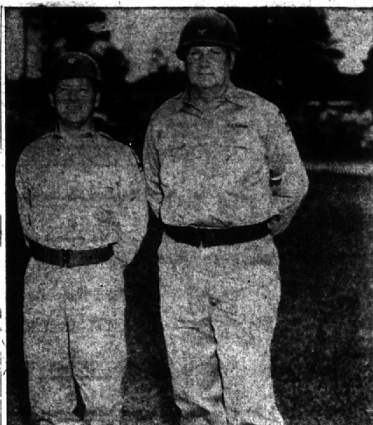
