Business Area's Long-Range Group Holds 1st Meeting

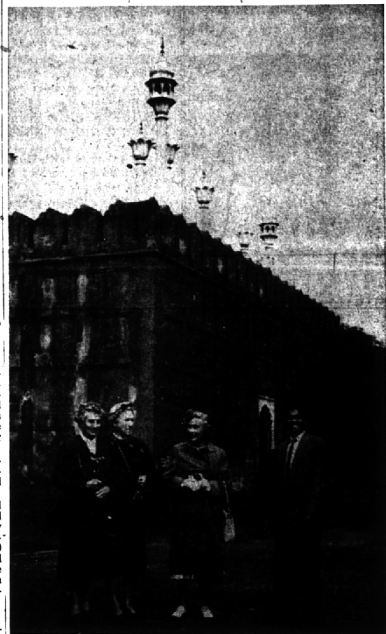
The long-range planning sub-committee of the Birmingham central business development committee met Thursday last week and discussed several important phases of a program to expand and make more secure the city's shopping center.

Claude L. Kidd, Jr., of Mulholland's, is chairman. Herbert Herzberg, city planner, assisted Kidd in conducting the meeting.

Following a discussion of local traffic and parking problems, and a review of the whole situation by Herzberg, the sub-committee approved the plan of raising \$15,000 from the property owners and tenant-businesses involved in the district, the money to hire a man to work with Herzberg over a two-year period.

THE NEED for contacting everybody involved was emphasized, since the future security and value of the downtown business community are involved.

A direct-mail and personal contact campaign will be proposed to the General Committee, chairmaned by Wilber R. Mason, Jr., manager of the local Jacobson's stores. Mason's committee will meet Aug. 4 to map further plans relative to the over-all central business area improvement.
