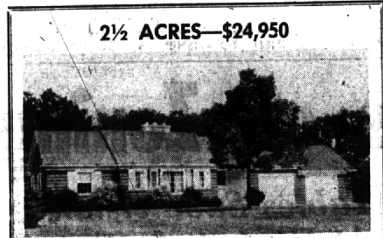


**Student to Attend Course at WMU**

**3 Cars Crash On Woodward, 1 Dead, 7 Hurt**

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—One man was killed and seven others injured in a three car collision at Woodward and Square Lake road Monday afternoon.

Leslie Perry, 40, of Madison Heights was driving south on Woodward at about 15 mph when his car struck the back of a car driven by Albert D. Parsons of Oak Park that was stopped for a light.

Parsons' car spun into the front of the car of George Hardy of Rochester who was driving west on Square Lake. Perry's car hit Hardy's in the side and the three cars welded together in the center of the highway.

Investigation revealed that Perry did not have a driver's license and there was no record that he had ever had one in the state of Michigan. There is strong evidence that Perry was drunk, according to Bloomfield township police chief Norm Dehnke.

Perry was dead at the scene of a broken neck. His passenger and two children aged three and five escaped with injuries.

**Southfield News Briefs**  
**Mayor Swanson Outlines Ideas For New Center**

SOUTHFIELD—In a recent letter to the city council Southfield Mayor Donald L. Swanson outlined his opinions regarding use of the newly acquired civic site and recreation property located east of Evergreen between 10 and 11 Mile roads.

He stressed the necessity of considerable study for to plan use of the land and suggested that the Lawrence Institute of Technology carry on a contest for students.

Each contestant would submit their individual ideas of an ideal civic center layout basing plans on use of the entire 166 acres. Prizes would be awarded by the city. The library commission and the parks and recreation commission were mentioned by Swanson as two agencies with the most important stake in the future of the civic site.

Features outlined by the Mayor included a general office building for city officials, police and fire departments, a library, a youth center, a nine-hole golf course and indoor swimming pool.

**May Widen Southfield Road Above 9 Mile**

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield road may be widened north of 9 Mile to carry heavy traffic loads off the proposed Southfield expressway. The \$200,000 cost would be shared by Southfield, Lathrup and Oakland county. A special committee of the three units has approved plans but city councils must still consider the plans.

Southfield officials demanded that the road must be widened because of possible traffic jams that would be caused when three lanes of expressway traffic flowed into one lane of the present Southfield road.

Present Southfield road right-of-way is 204 feet, enough for five lanes.

OAKLAND COUNTY which usually pays half the total cost will pay 75 per cent, Southfield would pay 17 per cent and Lathrup 7 per cent.

The county will pay the additional 26 per cent for credit given Southfield and Lathrup on 11 Mile, a county road that would be turned over to the cities without being improved.

Under the present proposal construction would begin in the fall of 1961 and work completed in 1962 to coincide with proposed completion of the expressway.

Lathrup village council meets the first and third Monday of the month at 7:30 p.m. at the House in the Woods, 19600 Forest drive, Lathrup.
