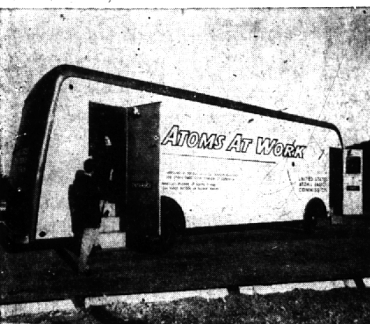

Some idea of the peaceful uses of the atom will be given Birminghamites when the Atomic Energy commission's mobile exhibit, "Town and Atom," is presented here, June 18, 19 and 20. Sponsored by the Birmingham junior chamber of commerce, the display makes its first appearance in the city. The mobile unit will be stationed at Pierce and Maple for three days, said David Salah, local Jkceee chairman. The display demonstrates uses of atomic energy in medicine, power production, industry, agriculture and research. A specially trained exhibitor travels with the trailer to answer questions and give demonstrations, Salah said.
