## R. B. Exhibition Highlights Vogel's Clown Collection

"Clowns are very much like lit the children, easy to laugh, easy to please."

Hy Vogel, Detroit artist, enjoys them so much that he often heads behind the scenes at a circus to sketch them.

Ten of those paintings are presently on display in R. B. Shop windows during the week of the Birmingham Arts Festival.

THE VIBRANT OIL paintings include one of Emmett Kelly, famous deadpan, cabbage chewing high-better at the Barnum and Bailey circus.

Kelly, a personal friend of the artist, and his painted colleague posed for Vogel several years ago. Since that time, the artist has sold several of his paintings to clown collectors, Robert O. Lewis and the young movie star, Bol Evans.

VOGEL WAS FORMERLY a commercial artist but found it "too monotonous." He has done caricatures for 35 newspapers, including the Detroit News.

The paintings, which are for sale, capture the clown spirit. Vogel says he doesn't like to see his subjects without makeup. To them he no longer clowns.
