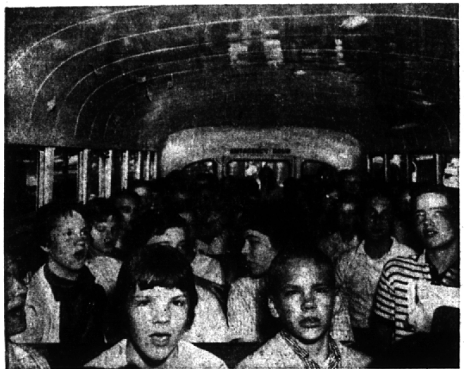


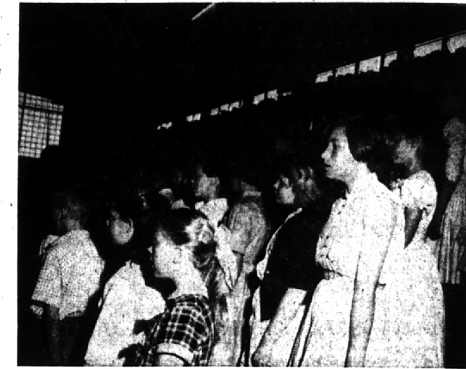
Assemble 1,690 Piece Vocal Jig-Saw Puzzle

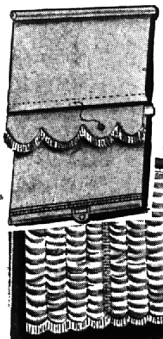
Officers Receive Diplomas at Howe

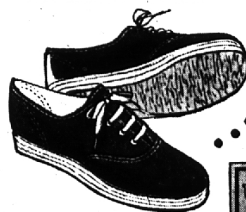

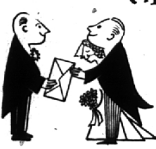
