## Wood Creek Approves Road Budget

WOOD CREEK FARMS—Wood Creek approved its \$6200 road budget last week and discussed an amendment to the zoning code which would place some control over the construction of new pools. Councilmen Harry Dobson and Kreider were instructed to work with the planning commission to study protective measures, stressing placement on lots and water purification facilities.

However, village officers want some regulation for future pools and will make building permits mandatory with a set of specifications spelled out in the amendment to the "Accessories Use" portion of zoning ordinance for future pools and will be submitted in the future for approval.

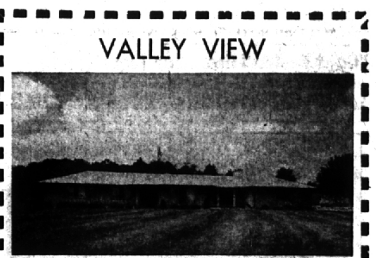
## Southfield News Briefs
