## Heat Headaches Cool Off, But School Auditorium Due

As we go to press this week, the weather man predicts the comfort of cool weather for 497 graduates at Birmingham high school's commencement exercises today.

But an article in The Birmingham Eccentric last week brought many comments from readers who agree community events such as graduation should not be held in the Birmingham high school gymnasium during June's uncomfortably warm days.

It also brought a hint from School Superintendent Dwight B. Ireland that the schools may see their way clear to building an auditorium within the next few years.

Following up indications that public sentiment was in favor of early-evening, outdoor ceremonies, we asked Ireland what could be done.

Ireland described giant-sized headcases accompanying any plans to hold huge events outdoors, such as graduations.

BUT HE added, "With a graduating class of 700 expected next year, and 800 the year after that, we may be forced outside."

There simply would not be room in the high school gymnasium for 800 graduates and their relatives, plus 100 faculty members and the band.

Asked if he thought public demand might result in construction of an auditorium in the near future, Ireland agreed "we ought to have a properly ventilated auditorium and have it properly ventilated with air that is not air conditioned, but water-washed."

Asked if the school board would construct it, he said, "I imagine the board will have to do it some day."

MUNICIPALITIES, he said, would not want to construct an auditorium for the use of people from other communities.

"I think that it won't be long until the school board can do it," he added.

"We are getting fairly well caught up on our classroom needs," Ireland said he had recommended to the school board that new schools should be constructed first before an auditorium. He said it might be possible to hold the millage for building debt retirement in its present \$5 and not construct the auditorium, thus avoiding additional taxes to pay for the project.

ALL OF which will be unpleasant news to a large number of citizens who told The Birmingham Eccentric last week, "We agree with you—the heat in the gymnasium is impossible!"

Among the comments was one from the Rev. Theodore Wiggazier, who had just returned from early evening, outdoor ceremonies in St. Louis, Mo., at which his son, Duane, was graduated from Concordia seminary.

"It was delightful," he said. "I don't see why it couldn't be done here."

Bloomfield Hills School Superintendent Eugene Johnson approved of the article last week's Birmingham Eccentric, he said. Johnson added that he considered asking the Hills school board for permission to set up both inside and out for the graduation of 162 Bloomfield Hills seniors.

"I dropped the idea," he said, "when the weather turned cool."
