High school's most delicious moments have been lived the past few weeks by 490 Birmingham high school seniors. The moments end and memories begin this morning at commencement.

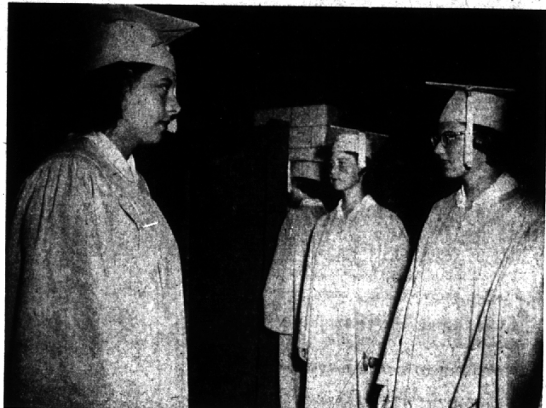
The senior banquet, the prom, "swing-out," the commencement are enveloped in a feeling of well-being and happiness.

## "Y" Will Try New Idea—Private Pools

A brand new idea for summer swimming lessons is being offered by the Birmingham Y.M.C.A., said Owen Manchester, executive secretary.

Since no public beach is available in the Birmingham area, the Y.M.C.A. began an investigation, he said, to see how many private pools had been constructed in the vicinity. He found over 200 in the Birmingham-Bloomfield township area alone. To test the project, a random sampling of pool owners were approached, suggesting the possibility of donating the use of their pools for use of neighborhood children for instruction by Y.M.C.A. trained personnel.

A generous response has been received, Manchester said, so the "Y" is now opening the program for registration to those interested in taking instructions.

Participants must be 6 years of age or older and a member of the Y.M.C.A., further details as to location of pools and time of instruction can be received by calling the Y.M.C.A.

Manchester pointed out that this program had important safety value, since every swimming pool owner knows that young children who do not know how to swim can be a constant source of worry.

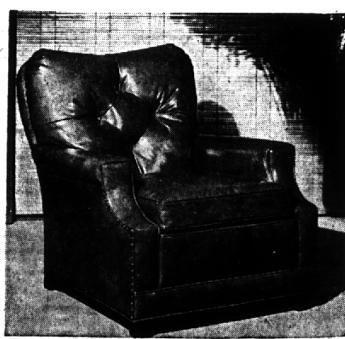
Parents should also be anxious to take advantage of this opportunity, he said, since so much of our vacation time recreation in the "water wonderland" involves being near the water.
