## Summer Music Festival Features American Arts String Quartet

The American Arts String Quartet will open the Cranbrook Gardens Summer Music Festival Sunday at 4:30 p.m. at the Cranbrook Gardens in Bloomfield Hills. They will be joined by Alexander Suezek, well-known Detroit troubadour in a program of chamber masterworks and songs of the English, French and Italian literature of the 13th to 16th centuries.

Members of the American Arts String Quartet include Gordon Staples, violin; Nathan Gordon, viola; Kenneth Goldsmith, violin; and Paul Olefsky, all first stand members of the Detroit Symphony.

THE GROUP was formed last year and made its concert debut with the Detroit Friends of Music. Mr. Staples, Mr. Gordon and Mr. Olefsky are recording artists for the local recital records. Mr. Goldsmith is a student of Mischa Mischakoff and a member of the Chautauqua Symphony orchestra during the summer.

Program will include the Mozart Quartet in B Flat Major, the Beethoven Quartet No. 3, Opus 59 and the first Detroit performance of a string quartet by Constant

Vaguelin professor of music at the Curtis Institute and the University of Pennsylvania.

THE 1960 Cranbrook Summer Festival will continue with four concerts on Sunday, June 28, July 12 and 26 and Aug. 2. The second program will feature an original ballet by the Severo Artists Ballet company in the Cranbrook Greek Theater.

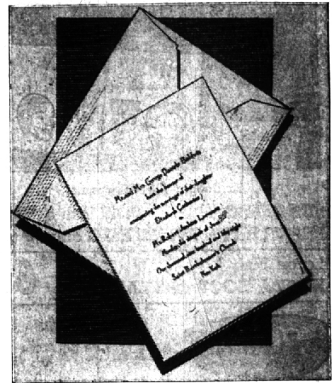
