Troth Revealed At Open House

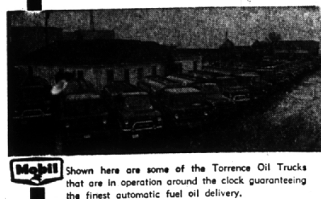
