"and we think multiple zoning would be the best use for it."

The planners, who recently dropped their consideration of multiple family zoning for a proposed new zoning ordinance, were in favor of reconsidering the multiple zoning last week, Herzberg said.

EGBERT said the now-vacant property was a maintenance problem at present because of rubbish and trash dumping.

Preliminary plans are to divide the block on Kirkshire into about eight 65-foot lots. Egbert suggested that the multiple zoning could be arranged, the authority could incorporate strong restrictions into the deed.

Herzberg said that after the planning commission dropped consideration of multiple zoning, under the proposed zone ordinance, the water authority property automatically would revert to the R-2 single family classification of its surrounding area. But he added that the most reasonable use, in character with the area, would be multiple family.

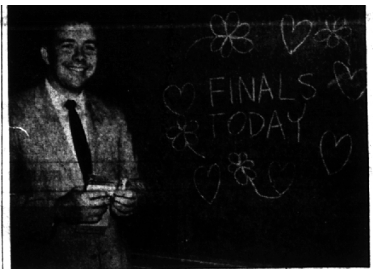
