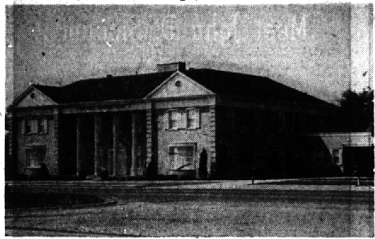


Named to Council At Duke for '62

WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

Note to readers: Thanks for all the nice letters. As many questions as possible will be answered in this column, but for obvious reasons replies must be brief.

Q. As some people age they seem to become more and more nervous and actually to get along with. Do they actually have all the ills they complain about? A. Older people, like a lot of younger folks, may develop neurotic symptoms which show up as repeated complaints when nothing is physically wrong. One day it's "indigestion"—the next day it's "backache" or perhaps just vague pains here and there. They seem always preoccupied with the body or a part of the body believed to be out of order. The trouble is very likely borrowed from the past—childhood fears, growing up anxieties, and adult disappointments. The average older person who has nothing more wrong than can be expected in later life very often needs a sympathetic listener and, above all, something of interest to occupy his time rather than actual treatment of mind or body.

George Zweig, 4540 Pickens road, Bloomfield Township, graduated with high distinction and honors in mathematics from the University of Michigan.

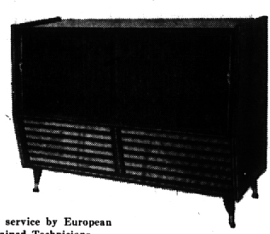

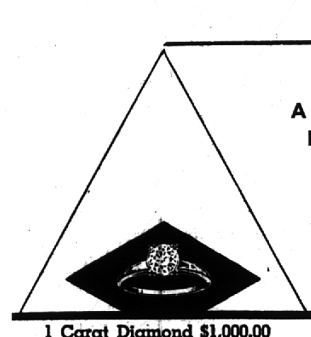

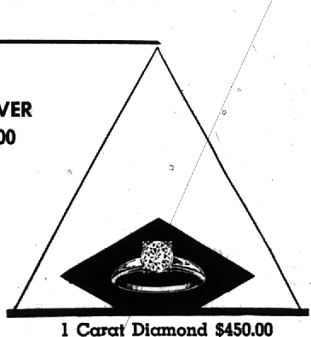

The Carat Weights Balance...But!
