Scholarships Awarded To Three Teachers

Women who work on the annual October AAUW Book Sale often say, "every little book helps." And it must be true for the proceeds from all the little books which Birmingham residents contributed to last year's sale will send three Birmingham teachers to graduate school for the summer.

Graduate study scholarships have recently been awarded to Alice Price, teacher of English at Birmingham high school; Mrs. Wales Bigelow, teacher of English and radio at Barnum and Margaret Carter, teacher of social studies at Derby.

MISS PRICE, who received both BS and MA degrees from the University of Missouri plans to return there this summer for special courses including Chaucer and his time, American Phonetics and a seminar in English history. She has taught at Birmingham for 13 years.

Mrs. Bigelow received her MA degree from Wayne State in 1958 and plans to go back there to begin work on her doctorate in English. Miss Margaret Carter, now teaching at Derby, received her MA degree from the University of Michigan and will be a resident student there this summer studying the geography, political thought and economics of Russia.

The Association requires that scholarship recipients must now teach in the Birmingham or Bloomfield school districts and have had five years previous teaching experience at either of these places. They must study at AAUW accredited universities and their study plans must be for courses in "content only" as opposed to courses in methods.

Four Families Attend Convention

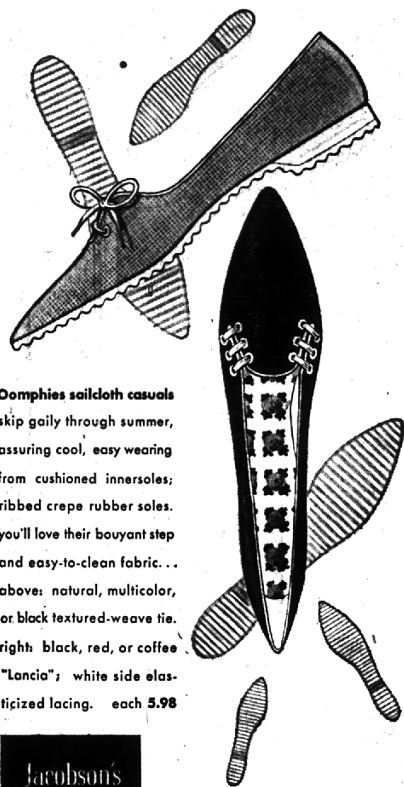
