Eastover School's Summer Program Starts Monday

The Eastover School summer program will begin on the school grounds June 29 through August 7. Two programs have been set up.

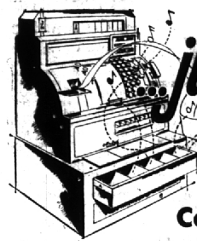
Bride-Elect Feted
