The signs will allow local and authorized traffic to use the two streets, but cut down on impatient drivers who have disturbed residents on San Rosa and Roseland with dust and speed.


Village Officials Get Understudies

Zoning, Insurance Question Slow Target Range Plans

LATHRUP—Mrs. William F. Provencher, a member of the Lathrup recreation committee, reported to the Lathrup council Monday evening on the city's new archery target range. The range, located on property owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley at 11 Mile and Evergreen roads, was first used last Thursday evening.

But before she could proceed with her report, Mrs. Provencher was bogged down in a morass of insurance, property line, recreational use permits and zoning questions by a cautious council.

Councilman Frederick Johnson pointed out that the range is half in Lathrup and half in Southfield township. Therefore, he said, permission for the non-conforming recreational use must be obtained from the township and city.

Curriculum Committee Asks for Volunteers

SOUTHFIELD—Citing the changing needs of the community and the growth in the Southfield school district, Mrs. Harry M. Clark appealed this week for volunteers to work with a curriculum study committee.

"Have you as a parent often wondered just why Johnny doesn't spell better?" asked Mrs. Clark, who heads a pilot curriculum study advisory group. "Or have you wished for more art and music? Or have you wondered why schools placed more emphasis on one part of the curriculum over another? Or if the schools are keeping pace with area growth?"

IF YOU ARE wondering, Mrs. Clark emphasizes, the committee and sub-committees being established to study curriculum will provide parents an opportunity to find out and help formulate future plans.

Mrs. Clark said the general steering committee she heads was appointed at the request of the PTA council, and has been operating since January. Functioning as a pilot committee, the group is now ready to turn to the citizenry at large, and hopes as many as 500 interested residents will participate in a larger committee.

THE COMMITTEE will analyze the curriculum, evaluate it, make recommendations, confer with officials and inform the public on the findings and the philosophy of the curriculum.

Glenn Schoenhals, superintendent of schools, and the board of education has voted to cooperate fully with the committee members.

Mrs. Clark stressed that the study is independent, volunteer plan and does not have a paid consultant. She stated that a group of parents requested it; the study is not a political tool.
