## Safety Methods Head Rifle School Instruction

### Bingham Farms Assured Of Adequate Protection

BINGHAM FARMS—For the peace of mind of residents living in Bingham Farms, village police marshal William E. Miller and the council are mailing a letter of assurance that adequate protection is as close as the phone.

The letter reminds citizens that, while Bingham has no formal police force, services of the Oakland county sheriff's office and Michigan state police are ready and waiting for emergency calls.

Stickers with emergency phone numbers are being sent with the letter.

FOR MINOR disturbances, barking dogs, domestic problems, and neighborly disputes, the letter advises villagers to call Deputy Marshal James Moore, daytimes and at night, suggesting that Bingham Farms can settle its own battles within the village family.

But in the case of serious troubles, professional police protection is on call and should be alerted.

Suspicious looking strangers should be reported immediately. Unconfirmed reports of an attempted child molesting renewed the summertime urgency for extra vigilance.

FAMILIES leaving on vacations should report the fact to the state or county agencies. If private protection has been arranged for, the marshal and local police should be alerted.

The letter urges that every precaution should be taken against "advertising" an empty house.

### Southfield Resident, Commission Battle

SOUTHFIELD—John W. Lemmon, 29229 Greenfield, Southfield, came home June 15 and discovered nine of his junipers for trees plowed up and an eight-foot gap in his property.

The road commission is widening Greenfield from 9 Mile to 11 Mile with the aid of a federal grant. If the project is completed by the end of June the government will pay half the cost.

Lemmon maintains the county has a 66-foot right-of-way on Greenfield, 33 feet from the center of the road.

The road commission claims a 120-foot right-of-way, or 60 feet from the road's center.
