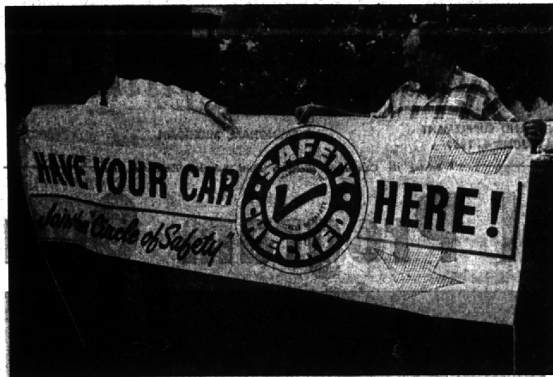

Ed Radio Network 'Signed on' June 3

"Midweek Michigan," the first regularly scheduled programs on a state network of educational radio stations, began on WDET, Wednesday, June 3 at 6:30 p.m. These live half-hour programs will be broadcast simultaneously every week by four Michigan stations.

Joining WDET Wayne State University in this new venture will be WUOM University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, WMCH Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, and WKAR Michigan State University

In East Lansing. "Midweek Michigan" will present news analyses and news coverage in depth from the four cities mentioned and will capitalize on the news sources in each locale.

City Holds to Original Plan: Lincoln Is 41 Ft.

The middle section of Lincoln avenue will be 41 feet wide, the same as it is to the east and to the west.

Birmingham city commissioners came to that decision Monday night after four weeks of tense discussions with property owners who all through the public hearings protested the "unnecessary" widening.

Commissioners, by this action, turned down a 31-foot alternate which spokesman Dean Perry, 569 W. Lincoln, tried unsuccessfully to get the city to accept.

THE ESTIMATED \$77,000 project will be paid in three installments. The city-at-large will bear \$50,000 of this cost, enough to permit the city this summer to repave, resurface and widen the portion between Pierce and Southfield. Francis J. McMillen, acting chairman of the Lincoln association's board of governors, praised Perry for the effort he has made in trying to find a width less than 41 feet which the city would accept.

"It's borne the brunt of this job," McMillen told the commission at Monday's confirmation of the special assessment roll. "The association stands behind him and the 31-foot alternate proposal."

McMillen, Perry, and a few others made a last-minute token resistance through several comments and questions before the commission voted 6-0 for the 41-foot width. Commissioner Charles Renfrew was absent.

Eric A. Pearson, Jr., 1130 Stanley, asked why Southfield from 14 Mile to Lincoln was widened only to 31 feet.

Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham said that the agreement was a mistake that will be corrected.

Cranbrook Shows Students' Work Through Summer

CRANBROOK—The 1959 Annual Exhibition of Student work by students at Cranbrook Academy of art, which opened the evening of May 29, will be on view to the public through the summer months to Sept. 21.

Cranbrook Academy of art galleries are open daily except Mondays and major holidays from 2 to 6 p.m., free.

The students' annual is the big exhibition of the year, designed, planned and installed by students from the academy's seven departments: painting, sculpture, design, architecture, ceramics, metalworking, and weaving and textile design. This year the exhibition occupies the three large upper galleries.

Also on view in the lower galleries is an exhibition of children's work from the Young People's Art center, sponsored jointly by the Junior League of Birmingham and the Academy galleries, and an exhibition of work from the adult classes taught by Fred Mitchell, Academy painting instructor, and John Strickland, graduate assistant in painting.

Robert W. Peden, controller of Wayne State university for the past 11 years, was named Controller Emeritus by WSU President Clarence Hilberry last week.

Peden, who is retiring June 30, received the citation at a testimonial dinner in his honor, May 27, at McGregor Memorial on the Wayne campus.

The citation was read by Olin E. Thomas, vice president and treasurer of the university. Mr. and Mrs. Peden have lived in Birmingham since 1948. They live at 1462 Pierce. They have one daughter, Mrs. Larry Shepard, Rochester, Michigan.

Peden was first president of the American Association for the United Nations, Oakland county chapter, and is this year's state vice president for the organization.
