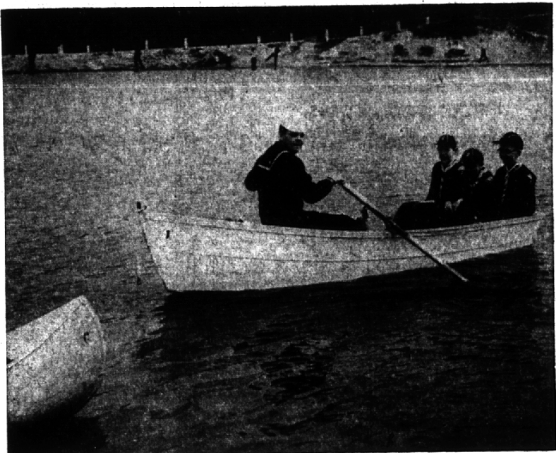

No Tax Increase In Birmingham's 1959-60 Budget

It'll cost you the same for your share of Birmingham's municipal government next year as you have paid this year.

City commissioners adopted the 1959-60 municipal budget Monday night in a total amount of \$1,676,920. This is \$49,402 more than is being spent this year.

The tax rate will remain \$19.40 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

COMPARATIVELY few departments are getting as much as a few thousand dollars increase in their individual budgets next year, an examination of the budget shows.

In fact, several departments, including the DPW, show decreases ranging from hundreds to a \$10,637 reduction for the DPW.

Judges', fire, police, general administration are up a total of \$31,508, primarily because of wage adjustments.
