

Garden Tells Story Of A Man's Recovery

Birds have really been singing in our garden this spring. I am keeping all spraying to a minimum because I realize I have not seen one robin this spring, and I miss robins in our bird symphony of song. Maybe some leaves will have holes in them, but such problems have been going on for a good many years.

Yesterday I visited one of the important gardens in our area, at the home of Shelton Wright, club driving off Franklin road. Mr. Wright had a cerebral accident (stroke) 10 years ago. Prior to this date he was in a sales organization with a fine business record.

Civic work was an important part of his life, along with his wife and family. He was president of the Community House board, active on the Boy Scout committee. After days at Oberlin college he was with the French ambulance corps prior to the entrance of the United States in World War I. Later he was with the American Red Cross in Poland and Russia as they gathered up lost, orphaned children who lived wild in the woods, seeking security and food.

THE STORY of Mr. Wright is being written with his permission, to help others who have experienced a cerebral accident.

One of his happiest experiences in his membership in the Metropolitan Activities Club (MACS). Around 50 handicapped people in this club meet once a month at our Birmingham YMCA. They are delivered by their kin, and the handicapped together enjoy an evening of feasting, singing, games, often bowling, swimming, baseball. The therapy is seeing so many

others worse off than they are.

The Metropolitan Activities club has purchased land for a camp east of Clawson and know that endless fun is ahead as they create a new headquarters.

FOR OVER 25 years Mr. Wright has worked with the Edwin George foundation. His home is on a knoll overlooking the former George property. Now one of his rewards for devoted planning with Colonel George is the majestic spire of the Kirk in The Hills as it breaks through the trees against the skyline, an ever-present reminder of the spiritual influence in his new life.

When you visit Mr. Wright you know how determination, an understanding family, and his garden setting have been important ingredients in his success story after a cerebral accident.

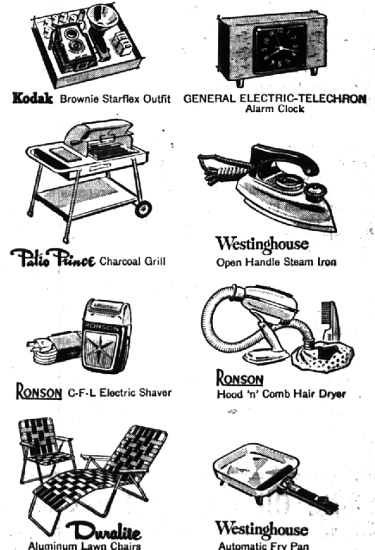
