If you should happen to read a story concerning Birmingham high's track team in articles located elsewhere on these pages, you should realize by now that Birmingham won its sixth dual meet of the season and finished the year with a 6-1 record.

That one loss, in case you are not a regular subscriber to the paper, was administered by Cranbrook, another ranking track power in the area.

THE IMPORTANT item concerning that loss was that it snapped Birmingham's winning streak at 36 straight.

Now that you have had time to digest that piece of important news, perhaps it is time to introduce the coach of this team that has a habit of winning with amazing regularity.

Kermit Ambrose has headed the track team for quite a few years now and caused quite a disturbance last year when he announced he was quitting.

Many parents and citizens of the Birmingham area convinced him to return to his coaching post and return he did after due consideration.

IT WAS NEVER really determined why he quit in the first place, but that is no longer important since he eventually returned.

Ambrose is both a gentleman and a scholar, but he lets neither interfere with his winning track team.

One bright afternoon was spent with this particular coach and the secret of his success was bare for all to see.

And if the reader will only be patient, he too will be allowed on the inner circle.

That secret? Ambrose has nearly 50 assistant coaches.

BEFORE THE SCHOOL board goes running to the personnel department to check the payroll, let it be explained that those 50 assistants are merely students in disguise.

A prime example of one of the assistants is state pole vault champion Bill Alcorn. Alcorn, who had already finished a short workout that afternoon, was coaching and instructing younger students the art of pushing oneself over a bar stretched between two poles.

Then there was the distance man pacing a sophomore runner around the track and the sophomore received a valuable lesson in the art of distance running when he suddenly discovered that those last 50 yards must be covered in a furious sprint.

Ambrose works on the theory that it is impossible to be everywhere at once during a practice session and he doesn't even attempt it.

Instead, the older runners teach the younger ones and Birmingham high's future success is assured.

Which, it must be admitted, is very bright at the moment.

## B'ham Runners Set More New Track Records

Birmingham runners competed in the "Meet of Champions" at Kalamazoo Saturday night setting a new school and a new meet record.

Most officials invited all boys who qualified for the state meet, regardless of class. There were no team scores.

BILL ALACORN, state pole vault champion, vaulted 13-1 1/2 in. in the rain to establish a new meet record.

The medley relay team of Kent Rathbun, Les Danielson, Steve Jacobson and Bill Green broke the school record they set a week ago at the state meet. They finished second in 2:30.8, eclipsing their old mark of 2:31.6.

Jim Reilly finished first in the 800 in 1:59.1 this becoming the first Maple since Quentin Brelsford in 1938 to run the quarter in under two minutes.

BRELSFORD'S 21-year-old record was 1:55.4.

This is still the fastest school time for the 800. Fraser Cocks finished fourth behind Reilly in 2:01.2.

Sophomore Steve Jacobson placed third in the broad jump at 21 ft. 2 in.

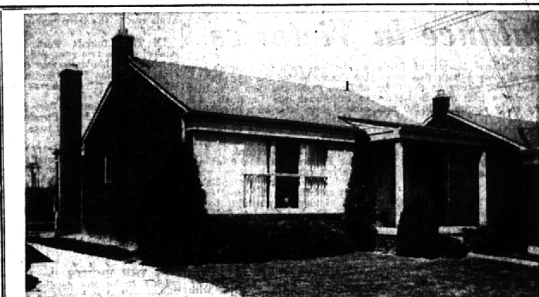

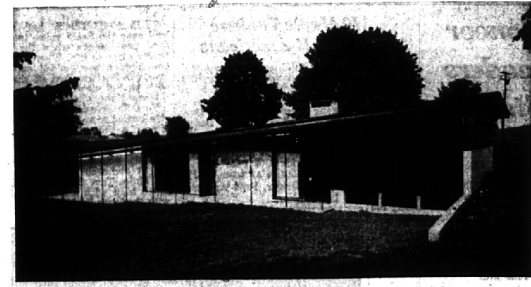
