In Troy on Livernois stands a building growing in all directions to house Gow's Little Acre. Be sure you have plenty of time, as there are hundreds of objects to inspect.

IN A QUIET old house in Franklin behind a picket fence sits Paute's Gift Shop. Paute Wilson does ceramics and mosaics and enjoys arranging things so well that she's opened her own shop.

OTHER COMMERCIAL establishments realize the value of the visual. The Kingsley Inn where you might expect only to eat, has on display avocational paintings by MacManus, John & Adams art directors.

Mr. Arthur Schiele (it was his idea) of MJA is currently conferring with the Grinnell Gallery about a show of good painters from this area. The show will probably be during festival time.

ACROSS THE STREET in the Fox and Hounds is a mural by Bud West. Well lighted, it is a fine focal point behind the bar.

CHARLES BALOUGH remarked about the bare wall in view while having his hair cut at Keith's Barber Shop. Invited to hang his paintings, Mr. Balough's works are there for the chair borne clients to contemplate while undergoing tonsorial transformation.

THESE INTERESTING places always have art work shown for you to see. Other stores in town will burst almost forth during the Art Festival with even more art work.

Even the portrait painters will be back, pitching their tent for your convenience.

WHEREAS ACTORS express themselves verbally, artists "talk" visually. Here's an opportunity to get acquainted with artists who live here or in New York or the Orient or Europe.

## Sidewalk Cafe To Be Repeated

The 2 p.m. concert falls into three sections: piano, a flute-harp-violin trio and a vocal trio.

Members of both trios belong to the Birmingham musicale and the Birmingham Chamber Music society.

Marion Hahn and Rebecca Frohman are accomplished pianists and former teachers in the Netzorg school of music.

Rebecca Frohman is a well-known teacher, accompanist and concert pianist in Detroit music circles.
