Suggests Millage To Pay Westwood Crossing Guards

WESTWOOD — A suggestion that Westwood consider a quarter mill tax for school crossing was made by Councilman Ted Shurtliff last week.

"We can't afford to hire crossing guards, the school board won't provide them, and civic associations are not willing to pay for them," Shurtliff said. "I wonder if parents would consider putting 25 cents per \$1000 on the ballot. Under the revenue raised, guards would be placed at all crossings."

His suggestion was not discussed by the council. Specially cited by Dr. Douglas J. Wood as a potential danger was the Southfield-Beverly-Riverside intersection near Beverly school. The village council authorized its engineering consultants to make a study of ways to improve the layout of the hazardous three-way intersection.
