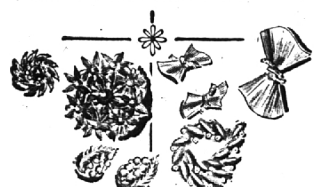

Reciprocal Police Aid Agreement Approved by City

A Reciprocal Police Aid agreement affecting 14 area communities and Royal Oak township police departments was approved by Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

Under the plan, departments would loan personnel and equipment to the participating community in the event of natural or man-made emergencies.

Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley pointed out that approximately 37 men and 20 cars could be sent to an emergency area within a matter of minutes. Within 60 to 90 minutes an additional 60 men and 12 cars could be provided.

Sixteen detectives would be available for identification purposes.

A minimum standard was not set up, but members are required to submit a list to other members regarding the number of men and amount of equipment they will be able to furnish in case of an emergency.

In addition to Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Berkley, Ferndale and Oak Park have approved the agreement.
