The new amendment will require special permission from the council for lighting over 18 feet, but prohibits all lighting over 29 feet.

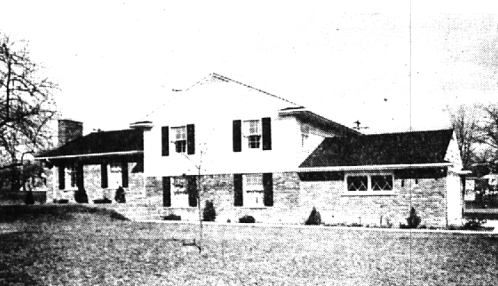
