Approximately a \$900 profit was shown for the efforts of those who worked on Cranbrook's Foreign A-Fair on February 21.

This money is to be used to bring two foreign students to Cranbrook during the next year; all of the profit goes into the foreign student fund.

Cranbrook had its third headmaster's holiday, or "Catch-Up Day," in as many years, a week ago yesterday.

The announcement came the preceding day when the Headmaster, Mr. Hoy, held the assembled students over after the twice weekly chapel service; being held over after chapel is a rare event and most of the student body sensed what was about to be said.

After making a few unimportant announcements Mr. Hoy declared that the next day would be the once-a-year event.

Wednesday saw no bells ringing which enabled all boarders to sleep as long as they wished; for boarding students this happens only once a year, on Headmaster's day. After ten in the morning any student could leave the school and go almost anywhere, restricted only by time and permission of his parents. Everyone had to be back at 7:30 in the evening.

The purpose of this day is to break up the term between Christmas and spring vacations. Since there are no other vacations in this period, except for the long weekend after exams, it is a very welcome occasion.

Last Friday, February 27, four Cranbrook seniors, Tony Fruhauf, Ray Sokolov, Ed Sun, and Ron Richter, were inducted into the "Cum Laude" Society in recognition of their high scholastic averages during the past year and a half. The ceremonies took place during an assembly especially for that purpose.

Judge Arthur E. Moore of the Oakland Juvenile Court was the featured speaker at the annual ceremony.

"Cum Laude" is a national honor society at the high school Kappa on the college and university level. Exceptionally hard to become a member of being accepted at the middle of the senior year is even more difficult as only the very highest of students are admitted at this time.

Tomorrow and Saturday nights, March 6 and 7, the combined glee clubs of Kingswood and Cranbrook will present "Carousel," the smash Broadway hit, in the Cranbrook auditorium. This musical will begin at 8:15 p.m. Tickets will be available at the door.

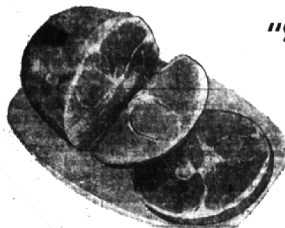
