Principal Nominated For New HS

The appointment of Kenneth P. Nagley to the position of principal of the new Junior-Senior High School is being recommended to the Board of Education by Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, Superintendent of Schools. The new school, now under construction at 13 Mile and Evergreen Road, will open in September.

Nagley is now principal of the Washington Junior High School in Pontiac, where he has served in an administrative capacity since 1956. Before coming to Pontiac, he was principal of Urbana Junior High School in Urbana, Ohio, and had earlier served as a teacher and coach in the Wilmington, Ohio High School.

THE CANDIDATE received his bachelor's degree from Wilmington College in 1948, after World War II service as a bombardier in the U. S. Air Force. He was granted a Master of Arts degree in 1952, from the Ohio State University. In addition, he has studied at Miami University and at Wayne State University.

The recommendation, to be made at next week's school board meeting, is the culmination of three months of screening qualified candidates from the entire eastern half of the country," Dr. Ireland said. The screening was done by a specially established committee.

One hundred-sixty three people came to the Bloomfield Hills' brightest lights—turned out last Friday to fete "Susie's 71 years."

HIGH ON THE list of gifts were an autographed baseball and football and lifetime passes to Tiger and Lions games. The Tiger pass is the only one of its kind ever issued.

Mrs. Miner at one time never missed an opening game, and rarely missed any home game. But that was one of the activities she had to curtail. Doctor's orders forbade her to drive a car. Now she makes only two or three games a year.

An embossed leather-and-gold book, listing the guests present at the Kingsley Inn party, letters and telegrams from as far away as London and Rome were handed to the hard-working little woman.

Lawrence Weik sent congratulations. Senator Philip A. Hart came from Washington to pay his respects.

MRS. MINER HAS been serving the community from behind the counter since she was post-mistress at the "Interurban" station in 1916.

Her husband, Tunis, had grocery stores in Birmingham, Royal Oak and Pontiac. They opened the Bloomfield market in the Fox and Hounds building in 1930. She has been working with her sons in their food specialty store, 41 W. Long Lake road, since 1946.

The old store was once a favorite coffee-up and counsel spot for the community.

Notice of Last Day of Registration of the Qualified Electors of Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Please Take Notice that the Annual Election in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, will be held in said School District on June 8, 1959.

Section (532), Chapter 8, Part II, Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, provides as follows:

"The Inspectors of election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides."

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said annual election to be held June 8, 1959, is Friday, May 29, 1959. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on said Friday, May 29, 1959, are not eligible to vote at said annual election.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with City and Township Clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the Clerk's office is open for registration.
