### Jury Impanelled, Second Trial Begins In Nursery Slaying

SOUTHFIELD—Raymond L. Ayles, charged with the Aug. 1 slaying of a Southfield nursery night watchman, went on trial last week for the second time.  
 Ayles' first trial ended with a hung jury.

Ten women and four men were named to hear the case. Circuit Judge William J. Beer impaneled two extra jurors to avoid shortage due to illness.

The 36-year-old ex-convict is charged with first degree murder in the slaying of Anthony James, 51, a night watchman at the Ingletrix Nursery, Inc., 22961 Northwester, Southfield.
