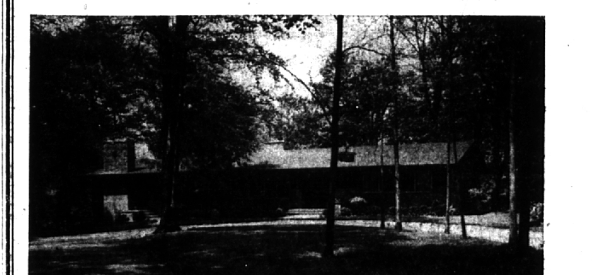
Police Arrest Man On Morals Charge
